Faith Like a Child

Have you seen a child jump off of a rock or a ledge trusting that their parent down below will catch them? Can you picture a child being willing to step across a scary bridge or down a dark hallway as long as their mom or dad is right there with them? Most children instinctively have faith that the adults in their lives will protect them and care for them. And that's the way it's supposed to work. But as we get older, and supposedly wiser, we often loose that faith when it comes to trusting our heavenly Father.

When we first came to faith most of us jumped fully into trusting God and loving and serving Him, but then as time went on, some of those commitments faded and we stopped stepping out on the bridges or jumping off ledges in our walk with God. When some of the difficulties of life came we may have begun to question

why things are happening and we may have even begun to doubt that God is there for us. <u>Tips For Memorizing Bible Verses</u>

(Taken From 100 Verses Every Christian Should Know)

- 1. It helps to write each verse on a note card and carry it with you throughout the week, reviewing the verse often.
- 2. Memorization is, at its core, the process of moving things from short-term memory into long-term memory. You achieve this through repetition, which means that the more you recite the verse to yourself, the more quickly you'll learn it.
- 3. Even after you've memorized a particular verse, it's important to review it again and again throughout the year. Otherwise, a verse you've memorized in January may become little more than a foggy recollection by December.
- 4. Don't be too hard on yourself. If you can't quite master a particular verse, don't quit and don't lose hope. Instead of berating yourself, just keep reciting the verse over and over, until you finally send it into your long-term memory banks.
